(Den Barnard) BROADBAND - It does appear that within the 30mph limits of Alkham a speed approaching 1Mb is possible if there are no problems with the incoming cable or internal wiring. After removing all the internal telephone extensions in my house and having one phone plugged into the entry box serving 3 other phones my Broadband speed remained stable at about 1Mb for some time. This compares with the 0.34Mb per second that I was getting previously and I would like to thank the local BT engineer for all his help. What is clear however is that Rambo will reduce your signal dramatically if there is noise on the line and at present I am back to the earlier speed as noise re-appeared. I contacted BT and they have tested the line and say the problem is in the house and I think they are right. At least the petition put Alkham on BT's books and since writing directly to the Chief Executive they have been in contact regularly to make sure the complaint has been dealt with to our satisfaction, which it has been by writing but not technically. HAZEL BURROWS, who lives at South Alkham, has for many years recorded the local weather for the Met Office and the Environment Agency. On the left you can see her pet sheep and chickens with the rain gauge on the far left. There are volunteers all over the country providing this service and each month a completed

form is sent to add to the Met Office records. This year, in the south east, the weather was fairly kind with March to June averaging about 35mm, 64mm in July, 11mm in August and 21mm in September. October was 102mm and November 185mm and December started wet and looks to continue dry but cold. **(editor)**

#### **PIMLICO WAY**

A farmer removed the hedges and trees from either side of Pimlico way in the 1980's and in 1990 the Alkham Valley Society decided, with the approval of the farmer, to plant a new hedge and some trees. It was a great success and the hedge has grown large and the trees are doina well.

However, the space between the trees and hedge was wide when planted but over the years the track is now too narrow for the hedge to be cut and for vehicles to pass through. Pimlico Way can legitimately be used by  $4 \times 4$ 's but because they can't use the track the vehicles drive over the farmer's field causing deep ruts. At the Parish Council meeting the council voted unanimously, but with regret, that the trees should be removed so the farmer can trim the hedge. There appears to be no other option and subject to the Valley Society giving approval the trees will be removed. It is hoped that others can be planted elsewhere. **(editor)**

**PIMLICO TREES (ER25)** - The future of a line of some fifteen trees planted 20 years ago by the Alkham Valley Society at their own cost and with their own labour has been a matter of local concern for some time. **IN RESPONSE** to the article in last month's magazine regarding the money that is being raised for the Church by the Friends of St Anthony I thought I should offer an explanation in the hope that it will, perhaps clear any misgivings. Firstly, I should explain that, last year, the expenditure, for heating, lighting and other day-today running expenses and some minor repairs to the fabric, exceeded the income by almost £2,000. Of that expenditure 77% was taken up by the Parish Share which contributes towards Clergy stipends, housing and pensions. For a small parish such as ours, with our limited opportunities for raising funds, it is easy to see, therefore, that there is very little money available for major repairs to the building. From time to time one hears it said that the Church of England is wealthy as it owns a lot of land and buildings. In fact, these investments fund most of the cost of clergy in the parishes and in the Cathedrals and, if these investments were sold off there would be no money to pay the clercy (Marion Banks-Nash)

If you are with BT and do a speed test using http://speedtester.bt.com/ (don't include www.) you will get your download speed. In the box underneath where it says 'Additional information' it gives your DSL Connection Rate. Note the Down-Stream figure and then compare it with the line underneath where it gives the IP Profile for your line. Basically the DSL connection rate is the figure that your line could have and the IP profile is what the exchange has set your line at. If the two are widely different there is a problem somewhere and it generally ends up being a fault in the house. (editor)

**THE CHURCH** in Alkham, St. Anthony's, is now open daily for people to walk round. At the Guitar Concert the building contributed greatly to the success of the evening.

THE WHITE CLIFFS - Melanie Wrigley gave a talk about the White Cliffs Country-side Project and provided some very interesting information:

The white cliffs of Dover are rare as apart from the sister cliffs across the channel there are few others in the world.

Gelatinous material fills cavities in the sediment, such as holes bored by crustaceans, and this becomes silica which is what flints are made of.



The grassland needs to be grazed and Di Smith of Sladden Farm has some Dexter cattle on the cliffs. One wild flower that grows is the cow slip; originally this grew where cow pats fell and the plant was called cow slap. The Victorians didn't like this so they changed the 'a' to 'i'.

Peregrine falcons are being reintroduced to the area as they were shot during WWI because they ate the carrier pigeons.

It is thought that a cliff connected England to France some 10,000 years ago and a large inland freshwater lake was formed behind it being fed by the Thames and other rivers. Eventually the weight of water made the cliffs collapse and the English Channel as we know it was formed.

Chalk grassland needs to be managed, otherwise it is invaded by shrubs and trees and the rare plants are shaded out and lost forever. The traditional method of managing chalk grassland is by grazing and this ceased at Folkestone Warren in 1924 with many areas becoming woodland.

Butterflies are found in abundance on chalk grassland and the blue butterflies are most characteristic of the area and in ideal circumstances they can be seen in large numbers during the summer. Many butterflies such as the Adonis Blue or the Chalkhill Blue require short grazed grassland, whereas other species such as the Meadow Brown or Marbled White depend on longer grassland.
