CHRISTMAS WALK – Just a reminder that the Christmas walk is on the 27th of December and if you'd

like to join in, please go to the village hall car park at 10.30am. The non-strenuous walk lasts about 2 hours and provides a chance for people and dogs to meet up during the holiday season.

SHEEP - There have been three attacks by a dog or dogs on sheep in Alkham leaving 15 sheep dead and others injured. The Police are appealing for witnesses to three incidents. Saturday 4th December, at around 5.50pm, the owner of a farm between Alkham Valley Road and Ewell Minnis saw a grey, scraggy haired, lurcher type dog in amongst her sheep. She shouted and the dog ran away in the direction of Green Lane. Six of her sheep were dead and four were injured and continue to receive medical care. The following day, on 5 December in Wolverton Hill, seven sheep from another farm were found dead. It is believed they were attacked by an animal, but it is not clear when this took place. Overnight on 6 December the farm between Alkham Valley Road and Ewell Minnis reported a second attack in which two more sheep were killed and one was seriously injured. THE ALKHAM VALLEY SOCIETY (AVS) held its 2021 AGM In the Village Hall on 8th November, followed by wine and delicious snacks. The Officers elected for the coming year were Richard O'Rorke (Chairman), Jane O'Rorke (Vice-Chair), Catie Webber (Hon Treasurer) and Joanna Walker (Hon Secretary). Two further members of the Society, Harlan Webber and Frances Marcus, also volunteered and were elected to serve as members of the Executive Committee. The finances of the AVS are in a healthy state. After a relatively inactive period due to various retirements and then the Covid 19 pandemic and lockdowns, the Society is now up and running again and ready for business. Under its Constitution the aims and purposes of the Society are as follows: - to stimulate public interest in the area; to promote high standards of planning and architecture in, or affecting, the area; to secure the preservation, protection, development and improvement of features of historic or public interest in the area; to protect the surrounding countryside. 

CHOUGHS – A legend goes that when Thomas Becket was murdered in Canterbury Cathedral in 1190 the choughs walked in his blood and gave them red feet. After his death, Thomas was given a coat of arms featuring three choughs and in the 14th century the City of Canterbury adopted a coat of arms with three choughs and a royal lion. Choughs are part of the crow family and

used to be common above the chalk downs but over the years have declined due to intensive farming and persecution. Because of this the Kent Wildlife Trust have brought an aviary of choughs to Dover Castle and this aviary is the first step to introduce them back into Kent where they could nest in Dover's chalk grasslands and white cliffs. Kent Wildlife need to raise another £60,000



by the end of January and if you'd like to donate, please go to www.kentwildlifetrust.org.uk/choughappeal. The Trust is also introducing Bison to Blean Woods near Herne Bay in late spring and similar projects in Europe have proved that bison, known as ecosystem engineers', can restore the natural biodiversity of the landscape. **Brian**

FROM THE VICARAGE - Every now and then, I find myself having a conversation with someone that begins: "Mr Williams! You used to teach me..." I'm usually in a supermarket aisle somewhere. We chat, and they usually tell me how life has been since they left school about their jobs, families and so on. But once – I think this was in a coffee shop – the conversation continued: "I always remember you saying..." My former pupil went on to recount what I had said. I didn't remember saying it, or when I might have said it or even why but evidently, he did, and fortunately it had struck him as worth remembering. Nevertheless, I cringe at the thought that some of my former pupils out there may still remember some of the other things that I've probably said... There's a story about a 4th Century Christian named Pambo, who joined a group of monks in the Egyptian desert. Another monk set out to teach him to from the scriptures. Pambo was inspired by words from Psalm 39 - 'I will watch how I behave, and not let my tongue lead me into sin' – to speak no more than was necessary. He died thanking God that in all his years in the desert, he had never said anything that he had afterwards regretted. Not many of us will be able say that. But I suspect that it's easier to earn

a reputation for wisdom and holiness if you're living among monks in a desert than if you're teaching a tricky Year 10 class on a wet and windy Friday afternoon. 'I will watch how I behave, and not let my tongue lead me into sin.' Maybe I'll try that as a New Year Resolution...

ACCIDENT – In the early morning of the 17th of December there was a very serious traffic accident in Alkham near the Folkestone entry island to the village. Two cars collided with the result that one was thrown into the air and ended up in the entrance to the field opposite Valley Cottages and both drivers were badly injured. The Air Ambulance was called but because the field was muddy it was not able to land so ambulances were used to take them to an intensive care ward at Kings Hospital in London. The driver of one of the cars was an Alkham resident and she is now making steady progress and able to walk with some difficulty and she would like to thank everyone for their warm wishes, cards, gifts and a special lady who provided John with a cooked meal while she was in hospital.

NEW FOOTPATH

Catie Webber would like a footpath to be installed between the path that runs behind the village hall to the path that leads into Newlyns Meadow as shown by the



hedge line in the photograph. This route is used frequently by school children, but the grass is very muddy at times, and they have been crossing the Alkham Valley Road twice to get to the path behind the hall from where some again cross the road near the bus shelter to get to the Dover bus stop. Additionally, the streetlight by the Marquis of Granby is not working such that footpath crossing is not well illuminated and Catie has written to the Parish Council about this and funding for the footpath.

TRAFFIC – There has been numerous comments recently about the volume and speed of traffic on the Alkham Valley and if you wish to contact the Highway Authority about this it is probably best to go through the Parish Council by sending an email to clerk@alkhamparishcouncil.org.uk. The matter will come up as an item on the agenda and a letter sent to KCC and if enough are received some notice may be taken. In the past KCC have always considered that the Alkham Valley Road is an essential route for emergency vehicles and are reluctant to install obstacles. **Ed.**

POSTCARD – Pat Yeomans gave me the original postcard which is in the Alkham History book. The card was posted in Dover by Mary at 4pm on the 14th of May 1913 to her brother who lived in Rochdale, Lancashire. It is also relevant to

recent articles about Wolverton Wood which used to be Clarkes Nursery as she says that she didn't know what to buy their mother for her birthday, so Mary bought her a pink spiraea from the nursery which is sending it up to her early morning. The postcard shows the Alkham Valley Road adjacent to where Pat lives and on the left is what is now the village green, on the bend is the cattle shed to Halton Farm (Court) which is next to Little Garth and in the distance can be seen the tower of St. Anthony's church. Pat remembers having to drive down the valley road in the 1960's and it was difficult journey as the road was mostly single carriageway with numerous bends. **Brian Wimsett**

NUMBERS - An email was received to say that I had used the same number in the masthead for the November, December and January edition, that being 334. I was grateful for this advice and pleased that he had noticed, and it does appear that 334 was wrong as well. The first edition of the newsletter was in September 1993 so for that year there would be 4 editions and from then it is 28 years making a total of 340.

KENT'S POLICE AND CRIME COMMISSIONER Matthew Scott has launched his budget and thanks to a combination of council tax payer support and extra funding from the Government's Uplift Programme, police officer numbers have risen by 788 since 2016. Kent will soon have 3970 officers, with a further 185 to be recruited by March 2023. The county now has specialist teams working in both urban and rural communities, a dedicated squad to reduce burglary and another to tackle drug dealing gangs. To deliver this it will require about 84 pence per month more on your council tax and further efficiencies will be made to deliver a balanced budget. LACK OF WOODLAND management in Britain is one reason wild species have declined and therefore the Kent Wildlife Trust are introducing bison to the wood at Blean near Herne Bay. 

PIMLICO WAY – Whilst clearing the overgrowth by Pimlico Way recently a stone with Bridleway inscribed on it was uncovered which begged the question as to how it was now a byway. At a Parish Council meeting in 1954 Pimlico Way was mentioned regarding the overgrown state of the

road and that the postman would not now deliver letters to the two houses at Pimlico. A 1950 act did review PROW's and it is likely that with the growth of car use an order was made to make the byway open to all traffic. There is no longer a hamlet at Pimlico and only one house at the Slip Lane end where the postman still rightly complains about the state of the byway. Reverting to bridleway status would seem sensible especially as it's generally closed for traffic in winter (as it is now) because of the off-road vehicles making it hazardous for other users. Ed.





IDA BAILEY - An email was received from a nephew of Ida Bailey who was researching his past and asking if I had a picture of Little Drellingore Cottage, which I did, and he also sent a link to the Secret Army. In the months after Dunkirk in WWII it was decided to set up a secret army to outwit the Germans should they invade. An underground bunker

was built in a wood (shown) at Drellingore with a chamber about 5 metres square and accessed by a hinged tree stump. Ida Bailey lived at Little Drellingore Cottage on the bend in the old Alkham Valley Road just past where the big white pumping station is. She used to walk her dog in that wood and accidently came across someone accessing the bunker and it was decided that if the Germans invaded, she would be shot. However, the members of the secret army agreed that in the event they would put

her on a train to London. Ida continued to live in the cottage and was unconcerned about ivy sprouting through the ceiling and died in 1994 aged 96. A little while later the house was demolished and a new vernacular house built in its place. Brian Wimsett

FROM THE VICARAGE - As we chatted to a friend who told us that she had 'done Dry January' my wife told her that He (meaning me) gives up cake for Lent. That made me think: how to explain that there's more to Lent than just giving things up? I had to do just that one morning years ago when OFSTED arrived in the school where I was teaching. I was given the job of taking assembly. In front of me, not just those I taught but, at the back of the hall, three inspectors clutching clipboards, scribbling away furiously. The pressure was on. Lent happens between pancakes and Easter Eggs, I began. Then I moved on the Biblical story of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness – you may know it. On the screen above my head, a slide of a medieval painting showed Jesus, unfazed as the devil appears and tries to lead him astray. The artist had taken the story literally; I wondered aloud how many of them had ever seen anyone with horns and a tail. Then I showed them a modern painting by a Stanley Spencer, Christ in the Wilderness - The Scorpion. Christ sits alone in a barren landscape, looking down at a scorpion in his hand, deep in thought. I asked: what might Christ be thinking? About the person he really is, perhaps, and how to be his true self? For Christians, Lent is a time for

taking time to think about the people we really are, and how to be our true selves. I finished by reading a traditional Lent prayer. The hall emptied. One of those at the back thanked me for showing the Spencer painting as another smiled over the top of his clipboard. Have a good Lent... **Brian Williams**

Anita James **SPEEDWATCH** – It's good to see the Speedwatch volunteers carrying out their work in Alkham to educate rather than prosecute drivers regarding dangerous speeding and driving. Offenders are sent letters which specifically target the driver based on various criteria such as age, type of car, speed and the measurement site. In the past three months they completed 22 sessions, recording 421 vehicles speeding and 333 letters were sent out by Kent police. Drivers who have been reported three times and those speeding above a certain criteria have their letters hand delivered by a Police Officer. Since Speedwatch started 1375 vehicles have been reported despite 2 years being lost to Covid problems. The fastest vehicle recorded in the last three months was measured by a Police Constable using his own camera to record a vehicle approaching Short Lane 30mph zone at 70mph; the driver has been prosecuted.

MANY OF YOU know the lovely Susannah Tapsell led Keep Fit classes in the Village Hall every Wednesday morning for 22 years. Whilst not formally trained, she had a wealth of knowledge and experience and designed an age appropriate programme. And she rewarded us with tea and chat afterwards. This has been a lifeline for many of the local ladies providing wisdom, camaraderie and motivation with the side effect of actually helping us feel better. I credit her with my rehabilitation. Many of you also know that I have now taken up the baton. I'm not formally trained either but have learned a lot from both Susannah and my NHS physio and osteopathic practitioners. Thanks to Covid and social distancing I have made changes to the programme that are perhaps worth mentioning. First of all we wear masks as we are a vulnerable crowd and we sign in as track and trace. We still do a thorough warm up which is vital as we get older and stiffer. We then move on to 12 minutes of seated exercises to music. That ensures we stay 2m apart. You might think that wouldn't break a sweat but it does. And then we do about 15 minutes light cardio standing on the spot so we keep 2m apart. With all the exercises there's an easy version and a harder version and if a particular exercise is contrary to your medical advice you are encouraged to sit that one out. We all have things we can't and shouldn't do. You won't be surprised to hear I always take the easy out! I'm far from the fittest. Because we hire the Village Hall we all pay £2 contribution towards the cost of coffee and hiring charges. We generally have a surplus which we give to a local charity chosen by the group. It's a wonderful Wednesday Alkham tradition. Catie Webber

FROM THE VICARAGE - Like most clergy, I have plenty of very weighty, very serious theological books on my shelves – but also others which, although lighter and rather less serious, nevertheless contain pearls of wisdom. I've been reading one which takes a sideways look at all things religious - including the increasingly popular idea that pictures our departed loved ones smiling as they look down at what we are doing from On High – rather like a celestial TV lounge, perhaps, with angels serving tea. It's not an idea supported by anything found in the New Testament, but many people nevertheless seem to find it attractive although, as the book points out, it rather loses its appeal when you're in the shower or doing something that you know they would disapprove of. An inscription on an ancient headstone beside the path in the churchyard at Alkham takes a different view: He is not dead but sleepeth. The words come from the gospels, spoken by Jesus to a distraught father whose young daughter had just died, and who he was about to restore to life - words which once offered such hope and comfort to a grieving local family that they chose them to be carved on their loved one's memorial. For Christians Easter brings with it the celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead and the hope of heaven for those who trust in Him. What no eye has seen, wrote St Paul, nor ear heard, nor the

human heart conceived... God has prepared for those who love him. To me, that promises that Eternity will be a much more exciting prospect than simply being expected to look down and smile as what's left of my life savings is blown on computer games. I hope anyway... Happy SO, Easter! Brian Williams



PIMLICO WAY — A firm laid hydraulically bound material from its junction with Slip Lane to the top of the rise at the end of April but either the material wasn't laid or compacted correctly or was faulty and the contractor will return

to site to put things right. The material is being laid to make the byway safer and stop flints and other debris being washed down onto Slip Lane. **NEW FOOTPATH** — In the February edition the need for a paved path linking the one at Newlyns Meadow to the path behind the village hall was mentioned. The Parish Council is applying for a KCC Members grant of £1500 towards the cost of the path and say that the maximum cost should be no more than £3500 and since this expenditure was not in the budget it will be funded from the parish council reserves.

VILLAGE HALL – For the last financial year the hall made a loss of £1500 and in the previous financial year a loss of £3400 was incurred. In addition to this there was capital spend which amounted to about £3000. However, the hall was given a small business grant under the Government's scheme for Covid and this has covered the loss incurred. Despite lower usage the running costs have to be paid and the hall's annual insurance is £850 and last year the utilities bill (gas, electricity and water/drainage) despite the reduced bookings came to £1250. In addition to this there is the hall cleaning which adds another £1200 plus Council rates, grass cutting, broadband and general maintenance.

EASELS – The Art Workshop has been held in the village hall for many years but has now had to cease and Margaret Danstead and Margaret Tovey, with help from Liz Lambourne, have kindly donated their 6 easels to the Harvey Grammar School for boys in Dover.

THE ARCHAEOLOGICAL DIG

mentioned in last month's newsletter at Dover's Maison Dieu (or House of God) has produced some interesting finds. Maison Dieu was founded by Hubert de Burgh in the early 1200s as a place for poor pilgrims to stay the night on their way to the shrine of St



Thomas Becket at Canterbury Cathedral, or when travelling to the Continent. Pilgrims received free bed and board (weak beer and bread) from the Augustinian monks who looked after the building. The impressive Stone Hall was built circa 1290 and at the digs in April the most spectacular finds discovered by first time local volunteers were over 50 small fragments of decorated window glass found in a rubble layer beneath one of the Stone Hall's six medieval windows. Photographs of the glass have been seen by medieval stained-glass experts who believe the fragments date from the late 1200's or early 1300's and say are a very exciting find. MOSELING'S HOLE — An email was received from Paul Reed asking if anyone in the parish knew if an archaeological assessment had been carried out on a local dene-hole. A dene-hole was a shaft which was dug into the ground in ancient times to extract chalk and a well-preserved dene-hole exists in a wood just on the parish boundary some 60 metres east of the footpath/bridle way leading to St. Radigunds's Abbey. It is on private land and is about 2 metres in diameter, 11.5 metres deep and has three shafts radiating off it and is marked on a map. Legend has it that it was called Moseling's Hole because a man of that name who lived in Alkham fell down it and when Paul was a boy, he and friends used to explore the area, but he didn't have the courage to go down it on the end of a rope. FROM THE VICARAGE - You may have noticed that Archbishop Justin's Easter Day sermon got a bit of a reaction this year — certainly a bigger one than mine did, judging by the newspaper headlines it generated. Archbishops of Canterbury have a way of ruffling feathers, with three having come off especially badly: the Martyrdom in Canterbury Cathedral recalls how Thomas à Becket, having annoyed King Henry II, was murdered there by four of his knights. Thomas Cranmer and William Laud also met sticky ends, one burned on the orders of Mary Tudor, the other executed by Parliament during the English Civil War. Thankfully Archbishop Justin is still in one piece, at least as far as I know. Approached for a comment, one MP thundered: The Archbishop... should not assume to know what God knows in my humble opinion. This strikes me as odd – a bit like saying that a doctor should not presume to write prescriptions. Christians have always recognised praying and reading the Bible as a way of finding out what God thinks – they don't call the Bible the Word of God for nothing. In fact, the laws that govern the Church of England are made by Parliament and oblige its clergy, archbishops included, not being let by sickness or some other urgent cause, to say daily the Morning and Evening Prayer, either privately or openly. So, the law obliges me, and people like me, to read the Bible; and reading it is more likely to prick

conscience mγ than confirm my opinions: I'm left asking whether I have loved God, and mγ neighbour as myself, or whether I have judged or condemned anyone, or whether I have forgiven others when have needed to. So please spare a thought for Archbishop Justin. He's only doing his job. Brian Williams

SPEED LIMIT – At the Parish Council meeting in March the results of the three KCC Speed surveys commissioned by the parish council to support requests for 20mph speed limit and additional speed reduction initiatives were discussed. It was noted that because of these surveys KCC Highways did not consider it was necessary to take any further action as the speeds recorded were suitable for the road environment. There is little evidence to show that introducing a 20mph speed limit without any obvious change in the road environment will make any significant difference to the driven speeds. Also, there would be a need for a permanent system of street lighting, whilst there is none now. The speed limits recorded were considered, by KCC Highways, to be within the given parameters for the road, and shows good compliance for a 30mph limit. (extract from PC minutes)



ALKHAM VALLEY ROAD – About 30 years ago the Alkham Valley Road was classified as the B2060 but was downgraded to a C road so it didn't show as an orange route on maps and to dissuade drivers from using the road, but this had no effect and the volume of traffic continued to grow. At that time KCC Highways considered that the Alkham Valley Road was an important alternative route should there be problems on the A20, now A2020, and it is likely that this mind set has continued despite the new A20 dual carriageway being built and is therefore in direct conflict with the original aim. What does seem sensible is that there should at least be a 20mph speed limit from just before the Marquis of Granby through the narrow gap and continuing past the village green to the other side of the blind bend leading to Dover. KCC may consider that this would have little effect on driver speeds, but it would emphasise that Alkham is a village and should be treated as such. Perhaps the person from KCC who wrote the 20mph speed limit rejection letter would like to come to a public meeting in Alkham to explain and justify the reasons for refusal. They are targeted by thieves as they contain valuable metals and can be removed in less than a minute and thefts most frequently occurs in car parks and you can find advice regarding locks or guards that are approved by the vehicle manufacturer and tested to Sold Secure Gold. If you don't have a garage, park in an area that's well-lit and overlooked and try to park so that the converter can't be easily reached by thieves. You should also register your converter and mark it with a forensic marker, which will make it harder for thieves to dispose of.

FROM THE VICARAGE - Some years ago, while visiting relatives in Cumbria, I came across Long Meg and Her Daughters. 

FROM THE VICARAGE - There are moments when the world changes; moments we'll look back upon, remembering where we were and what we were doing when we heard about what had happened. Perhaps the loss of our Queen will prove to be one of those moments. She had been there for as long as most of us can remember. She was full of years, and her passing was not entirely unexpected. And yet... suddenly the world has changed. I never met her, have no personal stories to tell, and saw her in the flesh just once. But as Supreme Governor of the Church of England she was my boss. I swore allegiance to her when I was ordained, and when I was licensed to this parish. In a world in which Christians sometimes risk being thought odd, superstitious or amusing, she never disguised the fact that her faith was real, authentic – not just something to which she paid lip service because of the position she held. Our reading from St John Chapter 6 speaks of the hope by which she lived, and with which we commend her into God's keeping. Most of us expect to retire from our employment at some point – but her example reminds us that there are some things from which we never retire. Despite her declining health she remained Queen to the end – still working, still true

to her calling, still the person God had called her to be. A reminder that we, too, never lay down our calling to be the people God calls us to be. Today, we give thanks for her faith, integrity and sense of duty, for a life well lived. We pray for King Charles III, the Royal Family and for ourselves, facing a changing world. ALBIONS - Do you know there is a critically rare cattle breed living in the Alkham Valley? No, they are not Di's Dexters! They are Albions, kept by Susannah & Keith Mannerings down the road at Chilton Farm. Albions originate from the Peak District, they were commonly known as the Bakewell Blues.

The intention was to breed a blue roan breed but due to a dominant white gene in the colouring, white Albions and black Albions are also produced. They are a dual-purpose breed i.e. milk producing and beef producing. The breed society only began 100 years ago and was building up numbers when WWII came along, followed by an agricultural depression and two batches of Foot & Mouth disease. By the 1960s, the society was wound up and people believed the breed to be extinct. Not so - some stubborn farmers kept going, swapping bulls amongst themselves and from these few herds, all Albion cattle today are descended. The Mannerings's Speckles herd was started in 1993 by Susannah's mother and was the only herd in Kent or the whole of the South East. Now the RBST (Rare Breed Survival Trust) has officially recognised the Albions as a breed and numbers are increasing but they are still regarded as critically rare (About 240 females total in the world). During the five years that Keith and Susannah have farmed at Chilton Farm, the Speckles herd numbers have slowly increased. Keith and Susannah feel that the native Albions are suited to grazing the chalk downland and fit in well with their Chilton Farmyard B&B business. On 8/9th October, the Mannerings' hosted the annual Albion Cattle Society open weekend. Members came from around the country, the weather was superb and lunch was Albion beef and halloumi cheese made from Albion milk (There is a slogan: "You have to eat them to keep them!"). On the Sunday, a guided tour at Samphire Hoe was given on conservation grazing with cattle and sheep. It was really interesting to learn so much at this local tourist spot. Susannah Mannerings

MEMORIES OF ALKHAM – A lady who moved to New Zealand and lived in Alkham as a girl worked at Norton Farm in 1947. The photo shows Norton farmhouse on Slip Lane, which was owned by James Ross where he only spent 6 months of the year as he worked for the Rootes car firm in their Calcutta branch. There



was always something going on at the farm but one thing she remembered most concerned the big bull called Farmer which gave her one of the biggest frights of her life. One weekend she was getting ready for bed and heard the most horrendous noise and the clanking of a chain which she thought was some long dead ancestor's ghost coming. Peeping out of the window she saw the bull Farmer approaching not only dragging his chain but half the back of his stall with him. She raced to the granary where the Ross's son Peter slept and asked him for help as Farmer was rapidly approaching the house, destroying everything in his path. Fortunately, the chain got tangled around a post which brought the big bull to a halt and Peter was able to extricate him. Mrs. Ross's father William Christopher Wordsworth was editor of the Calcutta Times and when he retired came to live in Alkham where he had a house built which is still called Apple Tree Cottage, and he was the son of the poet William Wordsworth. editor



I wasn't local, I told him, but from Kent. At once I found myself discussing St Augustine, King Ethelbert, and Queen Bertha – he had, he said, studied History at university. When he learned that I planned to visit Wells he told me that he had once been a chorister at Wells Cathedral. He had known a well-known Church of England cleric - a good priest, he said, but probably bound for Hell. How was I to respond? Let's hope not, I replied. I simply listened as he shared his thoughts on churches and psychiatric units. Then the bus arrived. Enjoy Wells, he said, smiling. Later, in Wells Cathedral, I prayed and lit a candle for my new friend. And yes, it's true - there's no such thing as being off duty... Brian Williams

Interestingly chestnut and horse chestnut are two different species with chestnut being related to beech trees and horse chestnut more closely related to maple trees. The leaves are slightly different with the chestnut trees having toothed leaves that grow singly and horse chestnut produce leaf clusters, with 5 to 7 leaflets growing in a circular pattern from each base. Chestnut husks have a more shaggy appearance, similar to that of a porcupine whilst horse chestnut husks are green and leathery, covered with sharp-looking spikes. Chestnuts are edible and nutritious whilst horse chestnuts are poisonous and can

cause paralysis and other serious symptoms if eaten raw and unprocessed. However, the horse chestnut is better known as a conker which can be attached to a piece of string and used in playground battles and the chestnut as a sweet chestnut which can be heard roasting on an open fire at Christmas. editor

FROM THE VICARAGE - I am writing this on Remembrance Sunday - a day of looking back and remembering, as well as looking forward and praying for a better tomorrow. It also happens to be the deadline for the December edition - which means that even though as I write Advent hasn't
