

It can be fun catch up with others online, but it can also be a mixed blessing. My wife once looked up an old school friend on Facebook. Depressingly, her page amounted to a rant against the world and the people in it. I knew someone, years ago, who scoured libraries for details of the Deal fishermen from whom he was descended. That can now be done online – but that, too, as I found recently, can be a mixed blessing. From the day I was born to the day she died, my grandmother was my best friend. As a child, I enjoyed sleepovers and outings with her. Years later, when I was a student in London, I recipro cated by inviting her to college for a weekend. Grandmothers were a rare sight in the dining hall, and as we sat at dinner a crowd gathered. They chatted and smiled. Their verdict: Your nan's great! But tracing my ancestry online recently revealed the proverbial skeletons in our family's cupboard, and I understood why she hardly ever mentioned her father, or the father of her children. The story that unfolded brought little credit to either of them - she had plenty to be bitter about, and today she might well have ranted about it online except that I can't imagine her ever doing that. St Paul, in the New Testament, tells his readers: Be kind and tenderhearted to one another, forgiving each other just as in Christ God forgave you. TRAFFIC – Dover District Council asked for comments on their Local Plan and the Alkham Valley Volunteer Community Speedwatch Group sent a response to the section dealing with sustainable transport and travel. In summary they have commented that the policy does not address the road safety concerns raised by parishioners in both the TAG and parish plan consultations. They go on to say that their policy has clearly identified the primary routes to be the A2 to the north and the A20 to the west and no consideration seems to have been given to the regular traffic disruption on the A20 through the Dover due to the inability to manage ferry traffic within the port resulting in heavy usage of the unclassified Alkham Valley Road. In addition to these comments when the new A20 dual carriageway was planned it was envisaged that the junction at the end of the Alkham Valley road was primarily to serve the large development at Hawkinge. Unfortunately, due to the problems encountered in Dover the Alkham Valley Road has become an extended slip road to the A20/M20 and it appears that the Highway Authority accepts this as a norm and are extremely reluctant to introduce any delays to this traffic. TEMPLE EWELL AND RIVER are also suffering due to the volume of traffic on the Alkham Valley road at peak times. Large queues develop on the valley road where it meets the junction with the old A2 as the latter has priority and visibility to the left is very poor due to the angle at which they meet. Some drivers choose to use Lower Road that goes through River on one side and Temple Ewell on the other side to avoid the junction. The one from Temple Ewell has an oblique bend under the railway viaduct and both sides are narrow and unsuitable for heavy traffic. Various improvements have been put forward to improve the junction but there has been no agreement to date.

SIT FIT – On Tuesday mornings from 10am to 11:30am Sit Fit is held in Alkham Village Hall and those feeling a bit stiff or inspired by New Year Resolutions may like to join us for a gentle but complete workout. HISTORIC FOOTPATH

At the bottom of Short Lane in Alkham there is a footpath which runs across the fields and up to the road leading to St. Radigund's Abbey and is called the Priest's Walk. In the 12th century the Knights Hospitaller were

at St. John's Commandery near Swingfield shown in the photo above, with the purpose of caring for and protecting pilgrims going to the Holy Land. Pilgrims from there walked to Alkham, probably though Ellinge and down Slip Lane to what is now the Alkham Valley Road. At that time, it was a river which they forded and then walked across a field which today is the village green and football pitch and along the line of Short Lane to the Priest's Walk which took them to St. Radigund's Abbey. With the dissolution of the monasteries in the 16th century the commandery was converted into a farmhouse and is now administered by English Heritage. The Priest's Walk also goes by Moseling's Hole which was featured in this newsletter. **Editor**

SIGNS – A local has said that there is a warning sign regarding horse riders on the s-bend in the village but there are no signs warning motorists of a blind bend, concealed road junction, concealed exits, emerging traffic and elderly pedestrians emerging from a concealed exit and crossing the road. In addition, a safety fence was erected on the bend to protect people, but it isolates the village green, effectively removing it from the centre of the village and reinforcing the view that it is just an obstacle on a busy, main thoroughfare rather than a peaceful rural village.

HARRIETSHAM is similar to Alkham with properties either side of a busy road, in their case the old A20. When the M20 was opened the traffic reduced significantly and now a 20mph speed limit is to be introduced on the minor roads to the east of the village with the old A20 retaining its 30mph limit. A survey was carried out prior to implementation and two of the reasons given for the proposal was avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road and preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which the road runs. The latter certainly applies to Alkham plus we are on a 'C' road, have higher traffic volume and speed, a blind bend and narrow sections of road ... Ed

LOCAL CONNECTION – In London to the south of Buckingham Palace is a well-known area called Pimlico and this is related to the small hamlet above South Alkham which is also called Pimlico. In the 17th century a man called Ben Pimlico was born near Dover and it is likely that the hamlet was named after him. He later had several public

houses in what was called Five fields which was a market garden by the Thames that supplied London with fresh food. One of his inns was called 'Olde Ben's Pimlico Tavern' which later gave its name to the area now called Pimlico. The hamlet of Pimlico in Alkham survived until the 1970's when the local council refused planning permission to restore the remaining building which was in a poor state. The photo shows Richard Goldsack who in the 1870's lived at Pimlico and made the Harvest Festival contribution but sadly died in 1914 in the workhouse in Dover which is now Buckland Hospital. **Editor**

FROM THE VICARAGE - I once heard a story — which may or may not be true - of a driving examiner who went to conduct a driving test. He took his seat, told the candidate what to expect, and then waited for them to move off. But instead, the candidate sat looking at the controls, muttering quietly. You have driven before, haven't you? he asked. Well, no... came the reply. But I've done a lot of watching! March this year coincides with Lent – the forty days of fasting that lead up to Holy Week and Easter. A friend of mine is fond of pointing out that the word Lent comes from the Old English word for Spring – so according to her, it is best seen as an opportunity, as a time of personal growth, rather than just as forty miserable days without cakes, biscuits, or chocolate. It all begins with Ash Wednesday, when the Gospel reading reminds us that there's a right and a wrong way to set about things. Jesus tells his followers: Whenever you fast, do not look dismal, like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces so as to show others that they are fasting. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward... It's a bit like that driving test – we can do any amount of watching, but until we get into gear and take the wheel in our hands we don't go anywhere. And simply setting out to please or impress others doesn't get us anywhere either - that doesn't help us to grow. So if you're keeping Lent, I wish you well with whatever you decide to do - and hope that when Easter arrives, we shall all find that we've grown, at least a bit, in one way or another. 

FROM THE VICARAGE - It should all have been going so well - Lent, that is. Except that it isn't. Not for me, anyway. Apart from one understandable lapse on my son's birthday I've managed to abstain from cake. But it's the other things I meant to do during Lent that I've struggled with. As Lent began, I bought a copy of the Archbishop of Canterbury's Lent book for this year, fully intending to read a few pages each day. However, as I write I'm still on the first chapter – I had intended to be halfway through by now. Emma Ineson's book, appropriately enough, is entitled Failure – what Jesus said about Sin, Mistakes and Messing Stuff Up. Essential reading for me, probably. I should explain that most Christians accept that nobody's perfect – we strive for perfection but, in truth, we still fail. She describes how Archbishop Justin once told a meeting that, Archbishop or not, he sometimes messes up - he's a sinner, like the rest of us. A woman ranted at him afterwards that, had she realised that he was a sinner, she wouldn't have turned up to listen to him! From Psalm 130: If you, LORD, kept a record of sins, Lord, who could stand? The Lord might not keep a record of sins, but social media does – once tweeted, it's difficult to move on from a careless remark. As Holy Week approaches, the Church remembers how, at the end, Jesus was betrayed by one disciple, denied by another, and deserted by the rest – a record of sins, remembered to this day. But it also remembers Easter, and how those same disciples witnessed the Resurrection and told the world about it. God never tires of new beginnings, and we shouldn't either. And with that, it's back to my book... Brian Williams

FROM THE VICARAGE - In June 2022 the late Queen celebrated her Platinum Jubilee. Crowds flocked to the Palace, and Paddington Bear had tea with her. In September, crowds lined the streets again, this time for her funeral. Now we have witnessed her son's Coronation. Three unique Royal events, all in the space of a year. I wasn't in the Abbey myself on the big day, so didn't get a copy of the Order of Service - but I notice that someone who was is auctioning theirs online. There is a reserve, not yet reached. As I write, the bidding stands at £221. Perhaps when some of the comments that were being made even as the celebrations took place are considered, the chance to own such a slice of history, even at that price, becomes even more tempting. While we were at home on the morning of the Coronation, glued to the television and only leaving the sofa to make tea, others were questioning the whole thing. Was it worth the money? Coronations in other countries are far more restrained – so why not ours? Should we even have a monarchy at all? Would this coronation be Britain's last? But history can play tricks. I recall once visiting a museum in Calais with a group of teenagers. Built as a wartime bunker, it displayed items from the Nazi occupation. An adult helper enthused, but they were bored. 

THE FORSTAL – In the April edition of the newsletter there was an article about Forstal Cottage which is by the road that runs from the Valley Road past the Marquis of Granby to St. Anthony's church and is called The Forstal. Prior to the 17th century common land belonged to various Lords of the Manor and tenants would have been entitled to graze their

animals on this land. Inevitably some of these animals strayed and were taken to a holding pound where they could be retrieved for a small sum of money. This pound was also called the fore stall and there was one of these until the 18th century at the entrance to St. Anthony's church and hence the name of the road. In 1810 the Marquis of Granby was built as well as a row of houses behind it on the ground of the disused pound. These houses were later renamed Halton Forstal after the farm that had maintained the fore stall and in the early 1950's they were demolished and a single house taking the name was built but this too was demolished in 2011 when the Marquis was extended. to propagate: just stick some cuttings in the ground in autumn and 2 years later you have flourishing rambling roses. Bryony, who lives in Forstal Cottage, has big pink roses growing up her wall which may well be the Albertine rose possibly contemporary to the period in which sharing rose cuttings was fashionable. She was wondering if anyone in Alkham

A RESIDENT wrote to KCC about the dangerous blind bend in the centre of Alkham and the reply from a Cabinet Member was considered perfunctory and following the usual mantra without addressing the particular problem. The letter said that schemes are prioritised on the basis of personal injury accidents and there have only been two recorded minor accidents in the adjacent area in the last three years, so the priority is low. The reply to this was that you should review the validity and impact of concerns of unsafe conditions and to strive to remove traffic hazards and unsafe conditions wherever and whenever they are notified. In addition, police statistics do not include accidents not reported to them or the number of daily near-misses, close-shaves and narrow-escapes. He also feels the proposed additional slow markings and warning signs, including a double bend ahead warning sign will have little effect.

SPEED LIMITS – In the past the national speed limit of 60mph applied to the Alkham Valley road outside the 30mph limits. The distance along the valley outside the 30mph limits is about 5 miles so theoretically it could have taken 5 minutes to cover this distance. If a 40mph limit was imposed, then the time taken would be 2.5 minutes more.

BOX TREE CATERPILLARS - Our box trees have been attacked by box tree caterpillars this year, two in the back garden had been stripped of their leaves before we realised there was a problem. The RHS website says that box tree caterpillars feed within webbing and can completely defoliate box plants. It is a relatively new insect to Britain. Whilst the adult moth was first reported in Britain in 2007, caterpillars were not found in private gardens until 2011, it has since become widely distributed across England. I have spotted a few other affected bushes in the village that have webbing and eaten leaves and if managed now could easily be saved. Please check your bushes. We have started by removing caterpillars by hand and are also using a selective moth trap with pheromones to attract just the male box tree moth. The RHS suggest using non-pesticide control such as pheromone traps which can help monitor adult moth activity are available from several suppliers including Agralan, Dragonfli and Solabiol. The mixed nematode biological sold as Fruit and Vegetable Protection has some effect on the larvae. The caterpillars do have a range of natural enemies including parasitoid flies, parasitoid wasps, earwigs, spiders and ants and there have been reports of birds such as blue tits feeding on the caterpillars in some locations. It is not yet clear if this predation will result in a reduction of box tree moth numbers. Emma at Box Tree Cottage

LETTER TO THE TIMES JUNE 1923 - Twenty years ago we constantly saw columns in the Press headed "The Motor Nuisance". Much traffic has moved over the bridges since then, and today there is the "horsedrawn nuisance". Everywhere horse-drawn carts and vehicles block the faster traffic, despite the praiseworthy attempts of the police to enforce the rule that slow traffic should keep near the kerb. In the great thoroughfares of London, the horse-drawn vehicle delays 95 per cent of mechanical traffic and increases the dangers of the streets to pedestrians and road-users alike. If horse-drawn vehicles could be forbidden in certain crowded thoroughfares between 10am and 6pm, what immediate relief there would be. The slowness of London traffic today, owing to the horse-drawn nuisance, costs millions of pounds a year in wasted time, extra consumption of motor spirit or coal in constant stopping and restarting, the wear and tear of brakes and tyres, and the abrasion of the surface of roads. And there is the human aspect of the strain on tempers and nerves. Today the vehicle propelled by petrol, steam, or electricity can do everything a horse-drawn vehicle can do. In most cases it is cheaper. And the time saved by mechanical transport more than compensates for any extra cost. If all our street traffic moved at a higher and more or less equal speed the relief would be immense. Incidentally, our streets would be more sanitary, for it is chiefly in horse-dung that the pestilential fly breeds, which is more deadly to infant life than any other cause.





GREAT EVERDEN MANOR

The planning application for a hotel at Great Everden Manor (Farm) on Lockeringe Lane has been refused as the proposed development involves external alterations and building operations

which are not permitted and the total floorspace created would exceed 500sqm. It would also have a severe impact on the single lane roads which access the site and could also result in unacceptable contamination risks to groundwater. There were over 70 public comments with local people being against the development whilst those outside the parish were in favour. A local businessman says that he has to take his large tractor and trailer up Lockeringe Lane and often meets irate guests from Everden Manor who then have to back up the very narrow and winding lane.



THE OLD MAP on the left shows Lockeringe Lane and Chalksole Green Lane which used to be the priority roads but now have junctions at Little Everden Road and Slip Lane respectively but retain their names.

ROAD RAGE - Several recent events prompted this article; a roadside chat with a resident; advise or abuse from a passing motorist while riding up the valley on my bike; a recent trip to France. Why do drivers scream up and down the valley nose to tail? There have been many accidents and deaths on the valley road during my 20 year residence and as my friend at the roadside said, some treat the speed limits as targets not absolute limits. I can never understand why South Alkham has a 40mph limit rather than 30 mph and why increase the speed limit from 40mph to 50mph after Wolverton Hill when there are a number of houses with driveways. In France they have recently reduced speed limits on roads like the valley from 56 mph to 50mph in order to reduce road accidents and injuries and 20mph limits with traffic calming humps in small settlements like Alkham. In addition, there are a few myths regarding lower speed limits such as congestion, structural changes, ignoring lower limits and emissions and www.transportenvironment.org/wp-content/ uploads/2021/05/11-01-T30.pdf is worth a look as it explains why these are myths. Alan Latham **TRAFFIC SPEED** – The first speeding fine was in Kent in 1896 when a driver

in a Benz was caught doing 8mph. The speed limit was 6mph and the driver was pursued by a constable on a bike and after a 5 mile high speed chase was apprehended. In court he was found guilty and he refused 7 days' hard labour so was fined £4 and 7 shillings, about £200 in today's money.

FROM THE VICARAGE - 'I told you I was ill!' Veteran comedian Spike Milligan's epitaph on his tombstone in St Michael's Churchyard, Winchelsea, was voted the nation's favourite in a 2012 poll. For the parish priest, it would have been a headache. The Churchyard Regulations are the Law of the Land, not just what vicars make up when they find graves festooned with plastic gnomes. They are to churchyards what the Road Traffic Act is to motorways – and like speed cameras, they can catch out the unwary. For instance, how many know that stone chippings and kerbs around graves are ruled out on safety grounds? Or that you can plant bulbs or border plants on graves, but not rose bushes, shrubs, or trees? Thinking of planting some bulbs in the Memorial Garden? Please don't. As cremated remains are buried only about a foot deep, digging anywhere near them risks the inevitable. That's why the Regulations allow only wreaths and fresh flowers to be left there. How many realise that you need a faculty – a kind of legal permission – before you can put a bench, or even a flower container, in a churchyard - or that tombstones and their inscriptions must meet certain conditions? As petty as this might seem, the Regulations aim to be fair while maintaining churchyards as Christian burial grounds in which the departed are laid to rest in hope of Heaven. In fact, Spike Milligan's quirky epitaph was at first considered inappropriate for a churchyard. Eventually, a compromise was reached: it was carved in Gaelic. Fancy your own quirky epitaph? Perhaps first ask yourself whether something like *Up The Reds* or *Long Live Rock 'n Roll* on your tombstone will mean anything to anyone reading it two centuries or more from now.

FLINT WALL - Much to their credit the owners Malmains Manor on Slip Lane flint are having their boundary wall rebuilt. However, fate has taken a hand and an articulated lorry took the wrong road and whilst trying to turn round knocked a large hole in the

wall and on the Warren Lane side a nocturnal vehicle which didn't stop also knocked down a length of new wall.

WATER LEAK - You may have noticed a water leak in Slip Lane recently. This was caused by a split in the 'communication' pipe from the steel water main pipe to a property stop tap. This pipe is made of lead which was banned in 1969 as it is known to be a health hazard. Affinity water has a program of replacing lead pipe but any pipes from the stop tap to your house are your responsibility. I replaced my supply pipe some years ago but it appears there is still a small length in the Lane belonging to Affinity Water. If you do have lead supply pipes the guidance is to get it replaced or at least run the tap for a minute in the morning and if you have been out all day for a minute in the evening. The standing water absorbs lead from the pipe and there is more information on www. affinitywater.co.uk/alerts/lead-pipe-replacement. Alan Latham

GARDEN WASTE - Dover District Council will introduce new wheeled bins for garden waste collections from April 2024 and existing customers changing over to the new service will be provided with a free 240L wheeled bin. The current annual subscription fee is £58 for a 25-alternate week service and the 2024/25 subscription will be reviewed as part of the annual review of fees and charges. Not everyone is in favour of this because of the possible weight of the filled bin.

VILLAGE HALL – The hall has two CCTV cameras on the front of the building as a security measure for the hall car park and the premises and one camera does pick up the rubbish bin in the car park opposite.

THE TRAFFIC LIGHTS on the Alkham Valley road near the A20 overbridge are for contractors working for National Highways to carry out their work safely adjacent to the valley road. When the new A20 dual carriageway was built in the 1990's a drainage lagoon was installed at this point to take the run-off rainwater from the A20 and the lagoon is now being cleared of built up material plus other works carried out to mitigate the problem.

THE **NAILBOURNE** Alkham Bourne as most people know is the natural stream that occasionally flows down the valley. The Alkham area lies on chalk that is highly porous and when saturated the water starts to flow above ground. In the distant past it created a small river which

flowed from about a mile west of the village at Drellingore where the water rises and archaeologists have found some evidence of this after unearthing a landing stage at Wolverton just to the east of the village. In 1898 the water company built a pumping station near Drellingore and pumped the water to a reservoir at Terlingham on the high ground by Hawkinge to provide clean water to the Folkestone area and this greatly reduced the flow of the nailbourne and had a bad effect on the lakes at Temple Ewell. From the vicarage - I had thought that for me, job interviews were a thing of the past. But then I spotted an appeal from Canterbury Cathedral for local clergy to volunteer to assist at the service of Choral Evensong that takes place there each evening. Then, a few evenings later came the test: the Cathedral fell silent, I held a tuning fork to my ear, and sang: O Lord, open thou our lips... The choir sang the response: And our mouth shall show forth thy praise... Over the next forty-five minutes or so I sang a bit more, led the prayers and introduced the final hymn. I'd made the grade, and was subsequently installed as an Honorary Minor Canon – which sounds grand, but I'm still just a volunteer really. Cathedrals need several priests, or Canons, to run everything. The one who organises services is called the Precentor - Canterbury hasn't had one for a while, but that changes in November when Revd Wendy Dalrymple arrives. The photo that accompanied the announcement showed her standing in front of a stained-glass window wearing a short-sleeved blouse and clerical collar with a splendid array of tattoos on her arms. I won't dignify the bile that this photo prompted by repeating it here. But evidently someone who is heavily tattooed themselves saw the story and remarked that they didn't know that people like them were welcome in church – but now they do. I look forward to meeting Canon Wendy and being on her team. And in case you're wondering, I don't have any tattoos – honest! Brian Williams

FUTURE OF ALKHAM VALLEY ROAD MEGGETT – PIMLICO JUNCTION

The Meggett to Pimlico junction is one of the most frequently used and yet risky crossing on the Valley Road. There have been multiple vehicle accidents and two horses have died here in the last decade. The Pimlico embankment was being eroded by rabbits and was



covered in a dying blackthorn hedge that presented injury risks to passing horses and walkers, and restricted sight lines for safe crossing. This has been cleared to provide a flat and safe surface with no kerb hidden by grass. This will reduce risk to car drivers, help prevent flood waters wash silt, gravel and flints onto the valley road that cut tyres, block drains, and damage the road surface; to horse riders on the dog leg junction that forces diagonal crossing reduce and also the local residents and visitors who frequently cross the road. In addition, the bus stop needs to be upgraded to a shelter similar to that the APC provided at Wolverton Hill Junction. Demand for this bus stop is increasing from the nearby caravan park, garden centre, equestrian centre, and new AirBnB's. The new crossing also fulfils KCC's policy of connecting existing footpaths to enable greater and safer access to the countryside. It's really up to residents to decide what they want together with the Parish and County Councillor's support. Martin Scherer

THE OLD POST OFFICE in the past was a property of some importance. On the right of the photo are the stables where

coaches changed their horses and on the left is the shop and in the foreground are the thatched barns to Halton Farm. The house dates from about 1880 and originally was half the size with a cat slide roof but was extended to twice the size which accounts for the gully. At the beginning of the 20th century the shop was added to the side of the house and the post office and shop which was behind the Marquis of Granby moved to the new location. The cellar doors to the shop can still be seen on Slip Lane together with the GR post box and a 'Stick No Bills' sign. The paraffin was stored in the raised shed on the right and this together with the stables burnt down in the 1960's. The property had several owners over the years, one being John Luxton who had the bungalow called Meadowside built on part of the land when he retired. The shop eventually closed in 1978 and became part of the main house. **Editor**

ASIAN HORNETS have become very prevalent this Summer in the UK and particularly our area of East Kent. We have just found one in a trap in our garden and many more sightings and nests have been found in neighbouring parishes. What is it? from www.nonnativespecies.org: An invasive non-native hornet originally from Asia. Asian hornet is a highly aggressive predator of native insects and poses a significant threat to honeybees and other pollinators. In 2004 it was accidentally introduced to France where it has spread rapidly and into neighbouring countries. Since 2016 a number of sightings have been recorded in the UK. It looks most like a large wasp, it is smaller than our native European Hornet. The Asian hornet is 25-30mm long. It has yellow legs, a yellowish face and one yellow segment on an otherwise black abdomen. I have put some pictures up on the village hall notice board but the best resource for both identification and reporting is the free app: Asian Hornet Watch. You can also suspected the report sightings on website www.nonnativespecies.org/alerts/asianhornet. Or alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk. The response to my reported sighting was very quick. Look out for large nests usually in trees but they may also uses garages or sheds. Now is the time that mated queens are preparing for over wintering in any small refuge. Emma, Box Tree Cottage

FROM THE VICARAGE - At my other job as a supply teacher one afternoon, I worked with some students who were soon to sit their Maths GCSE exam. As they finished coursework and practiced past exam papers, one looked up: "'Ere Sir – are you a vicar?" They thought I sounded like one, apparently - and my cover was soon blown. Fascinated at having a supply teacher who doubled as a vicar, questions began to flow. "Don't Christians say that God's everywhere?" one girl asked. I replied that they do. She turned pale. "So, whatever you're doing, God knows about it..." The idea bothered her – but she was right. 'O Lord, you have searched me and known me...' says Psalm 139. 'You know when I sit down and when I rise up... Where can I flee from your presence? If I ascend to heaven, you are there... if I make my bed in the grave, you are there....' Yes, Christians do believe that God's everywhere. November begins with All Saints' Day. While others are preoccupied with ghoulies, ghosties and four-legged posties, Christians celebrate the lives of saints. I used to serve in a church that was shared with a Greek Orthodox congregation. Like other Orthodox churches it was decorated with pictures of the saints. We were in their company; their eyes seemed to follow you around, and if that felt unnerving it nevertheless held out the comforting thought that whatever life brings, we never journey through it alone. The saints are everywhere, too. A last word from St John of the Cross, a Spanish Carmelite monk. He once spoke with a nun who was frantic with worry about what God thought of the life she'd lived. "Don't worry," he said. "At the Judgement, you will be judged by someone who loves you." Brian Williams

PREDICTION — The Drelligore Nailbourne is a natural spring that runs when the water table is high and appears to flow in roughly a 13 year cycle. In recent times it flowed in 1974, 1987, 2001 and 2014 which makes the village green a lake and cause floods elsewhere and if the cycle continues it should flow again in

2027. Ray Latham who lives in the village has a rain gauge and since 2014 has recorded the monthly rainfall and he predicts it will flow next year as the rainfall in 2023 is the highest it has been over that period. The photo above shows the village green in 2014 with a couple going for paddle.

POWER CUT 2nd NOVEMBER 2023 - Storm Cairan brought down a good number of trees and branches which in turn took out the power supply in the area. It was off from 8.0am to 4.0pm and during that period I walked and met a number of people who told me of their particular problems; no light to read by, no digital telephone line, no TV and no internet browsing, though the latter was not a domestic power issue this time. I had similar and had been looking for a means to provide my own power. One answer is a rechargeable battery power station or pack. I have bought a 0.5kWh EcoFlow available from Argos. Other brands are Anker and Jackery. It has two 3 pin sockets and is rated at 500 Watts and so

you can plug in your router, TV, gas boiler, gas cooker, table lamps and many other low power items, less than 500 Watts. The 3kW radiator or kettle will not work though you could buy a low power kettle used by campers. It also has 4 USB sockets for charging items and a 12 volt car socket. The photograph shows the power pack running a TV and router. Alan Latham



SAFETY CONCERN – An Alkham resident has been trying to do something about the danger of accessing his property from and to the adjacent busy Alkham Valley road but has had no success with KCC, the Police or the Health and Safety Executive, the latter advising him to contact the Ombudsman. Their initial assessment is that, based on the KCC letter, they are unable to determine whether the KCC have had the opportunity to consider the complaint and reply. They have instructed him to contact KCC directly, again, and request them to escalate the complaint and send him a final response from the Cabinet Member for Highways & Transport.

FROM THE VICARAGE - If you want to know the true meaning of Christmas, we're told, be like the carrot in one of the cleverest TV commercials I've seen so far this year, based on Roald Dahl's Charlie and the Chocolate Factory. Christmas is, apparently, about being good, unselfish, and prepared to share with others. At least that along with encouragement to shop in a certain supermarket - seems to be the message of the advert. It's easier to make sense of the advert if you know the original story. On holiday in Scotland years ago I came across a book called The Story of Goliath and Wee Davie. It is based on the Biblical story in which, against the odds, David the shepherd boy defeats Goliath the Philistine giant in battle. But according to Jimmie Macgregor's illustrated version, alcohol was the real reason for Goliath's downfall – but the humour only really works if you do know the original story. I was at a clergy meeting not long ago where we were encouraged to have something available in our churches that might explain, in simple terms, what Christianity is about - because the days when it could be assumed that everyone would know the original story have gone. Over the next few weeks there will be plenty of opportunities to hear the original Christmas story.
