has continued to champion our request and the Parish Council will now be submitting a formal planning permission request to Dover District Council and, all things being equal, we will get our Terrain. This now means I'll be looking to try and collect the pledges during February with a view to commencing work in March to have a grand opening perhaps on Easter Monday or possibly the May Day Bank Holiday. First, I'll be contacting everyone individually to remind them of their pledge amount, second I'm looking for volunteers who are willing to do a little manual labour, cutting the area out and a little digging over a period of time. I will also look further into a possible suggestion from Alkham Cricket Club to discuss some type of arrangement with them as a combined or affiliated club. With regard to the money, Andrew Koo and Ken Spencer, have agreed to help with the collection and management, this also ensures that all the funds are being used correctly rather than just me on my own being responsible. I've already had a few requests about arranging some more games either in the village or at other local venues and there are already plans for some useful game arranging tech for anyone with a smart phone, and "yes" there's lots of support on how to use this and set things up. The project is happening and I look forward to playing a game or two with all of you at some point over the coming months! Any questions please let me know. Christmas and it's a memory of a school trip to Reculver in 1957 and on the back of the card he gives details about the buses. I live in the Old Post Office in Alkham and John and I worked together for a number of years and it was amusing to hear that when he was cub they were camping nearby and got washed out by the rain and spent the

night in one of the outbuildings which has since been demolished. A lot has changed since then and it would be great to see the burgundy and cream buses again rather than the bland Stagecoach colours.



MARCH TRIVIA - The word 'March' comes from the Roman 'Martius'. This was originally the first month of the Roman calendar and was named after Mars, the god of war. For centuries, March was the beginning of our calendar year. We changed to the 'New Style' or 'Gregorian calendar in 1752, and it is only since then that the year began on 1st January. The last three days of March were said to be borrowed from April. The Anglo-Saxons called the month Hlyd monath which means Stormy month, or Hraed monath which means Rugged month. The latest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 10 March (when Easter Sunday falls on 25 April) which occurred in 1666, 1734, 1886 and 1943 and will next occur in 2038. All through Lent the traditional games played are marbles and skipping. The games were stopped on the stroke of twelve noon on Good Friday, which in some places was called Marble Day or Long Rope Day. The game of marbles has been played for hundreds of years and some historians say that it might have been started by rolling eggs. In the past, round stones, hazelnuts, round balls of baked clay and even cherry stones have been used. Jackie Grebby

**FROM THE VICARAGE** - One of the joys of retirement, according to 80's pop star turned radio presenter, writer, Strictly contestant and now retired parish priest the Reverend Richard Coles, is being able to stand back from the church's debates. "When one erupts," he wrote not long ago, "it's like walking past a pub you used to drink in and seeing someone throw a chair through the window: startling, but not your problem." I wouldn't know - I'm not there yet. I think I know what he means - but these debates aren't trivial, which probably explains why the Church of England's troubles seem to keep making headlines. But more about retirement. I've had the seminar: Move away from your last parish when you retire, so that the new priest gets a fair chance to make a go of things... If you're asked to help in a church somewhere, remember - you're NOT the vicar ... Don't hoover up all the funerals at the local crematorium and expect to be popular the list goes on. And now I've spoken with my boss, completed the paperwork, and received an email asking me to get on with telling everyone when it's happening. And so here it is: I shall retire as Priestin-Charge of the Parish of Alkham with Capel le Ferne and Hougham in the autumn, when I reach age 70. My last Sunday will be 28<sup>th</sup> September - the 23<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of my Ordination as a priest. "The Fruit of the Spirit," St Paul wrote, "is Love, Joy and Peace." Debates aside, there really are churches near you where Christians are trying to live that out through prayer, caring for others, running lunch clubs, supporting food banks and so on.
