ALKHAM VILLAGE HALL

The hall was built in 1931 and the vicar on the left said it would become the centre of social life and add to the brightness and social life of the community, which it has. At the time the sanitary

arrangements were very rudimentary and remained so until the 1990's when the 'buy a brick' campaign helped to build the extension with upto-date facilities and replaced the above entrance to the hall. Several improvements have been carried out since then including a stage but with the new village hall committee there has been a renaissance with a lot of manual work carried out for free by some of the members of the committee and others for which we are grateful. The large wooden planters outside the hall are being filled and when planted it will give a sense of social space to the outside of the hall together with a large teak bench which will be installed soon and further details of this and other improvements will be given in a later newsletter. **editor**

ALKHAM BOREHOLE – It is encouraging to see that the water level in the borehole is about 37m which is well below the 45.75 that it reached last year and caused flooding. As previously mentioned in recent years the green flooded in 1974, 1987, 2001 and 2014 which is roughly a 13-year cycle so hopefully last year's was our recurrent flood. **Editor**

PLANNING APPLICATION – In the June 2024 newsletter mention was made of a planning application to install a drainage treatment works adjacent to Great Everden Manor for the two currently empty barns. For those not familiar with Great Everden it is on the narrow road which runs across the top from Alkham to Hawkinge and adjacent to



the manor are the two barns. Dover District Council has granted permission for the works and says there will be no impact on the residential amenity of the occupants of the adjacent properties and it is therefore considered that the proposal has no impact on the living conditions of neighbours and accords with the aims and objectives of the NPPF and the development is considered to preserve the character and appearance of the area, with no harm to residential amenity. **Editor**

FROM THE VICARAGE - You wouldn't think that a Christmas Tree would be so controversial. But it seems that when St Anthony's was being decorated for Christmas a visitor took exception to the fact that there was a Christmas Tree in church, arguing from a series of Bible passages that this was pandering to paganism. Had I been there, I would have reminded our friend that the tradition around Christmas Trees can be traced back not to paganism but to a Christian missionary. It's said that having entered a monastery as a young man Winfred, or Boniface as he became known, travelled as a Christian missionary to what is now Germany. There he came across a tree, the 'Thunder Oak' where each year the locals would sacrifice a child to the pagan god Thor. Boniface and his companions arrived as the sacrifice was imminent, carried out a risk assessment and decided to fell the oak anyway. It was expected that Thor would strike him dead – but Boniface survived unscathed. The job done, a small fir tree was found growing nearby. Its evergreen needles, Boniface pointed out, spoke of eternal life; its branches pointed towards heaven; henceforth it would be called the tree of the Christchild. Having made his case, many of those who were there were baptised. The practice of having a small evergreen tree in the house at Christmas spread across Germany; those who eventually settled in America took the tradition with them. With both George III's German wife Queen Charlotte and Prince Albert having Christmas trees in their homes, the custom quickly spread in this country, too. Sadly, most of our trees are last seen in January, waiting for the dustcart – but still with their needles speaking of eternal life, and their branches pointing towards heaven.... Brian Williams

MARCH TRIVIA - The word 'March' comes from the Roman 'Martius'. This was originally the first month of the Roman calendar and was named after Mars, the god of war. For centuries, March was the beginning of our calendar year. We changed to the 'New Style' or 'Gregorian calendar in 1752, and it is only since then that the year began on 1st January. The last three days of March were said to be borrowed from April. The Anglo-Saxons called the month Hlyd monath which means Stormy month, or Hraed monath which means Rugged month. The latest date Ash Wednesday can occur is 10 March (when Easter Sunday falls on 25 April) which occurred in 1666, 1734, 1886 and 1943 and will next occur in 2038. All through Lent the traditional games played are marbles and skipping. The games were stopped on the stroke of twelve noon on Good Friday, which in some places was called Marble Day or Long Rope Day. The game of marbles has been played for hundreds of years and some historians say that it might have been started by rolling eggs. In the past, round stones, hazelnuts, round balls of baked clay and even cherry stones have been used. Jackie Grebby

My last Sunday will be 28th September - the 23rd anniversary of my Ordination as a priest. "The Fruit of the Spirit," St Paul wrote, "is Love, Joy and Peace." Debates aside, there really are churches near you where Christians are trying to live that out through prayer, caring for others, running lunch clubs, supporting food banks and so on. TAXI - I recently travelled in a London taxi and chatted to the driver. He told me that the number of taxi drivers had dropped by about 7000 since before Covid. Generally, costs have risen; previous short cuts have been blocked, 20 mph limits are widespread. All this means journeys take longer and the passenger must therefore pay more. In the past a cabbie might take 30 jobs in a day, 18 is now typical. Some food delivery bikes tend to be reckless nowadays; so greater alertness than ever is needed. The advent of compulsory card machines in the cabs discouraged retired drivers from doing a day or two a week, due to the costs of the card machine and the end of cash payments. To become a London taxi driver, it is necessary to do the "knowledge". This involves an intimate on the ground familiarity with the street geography of London. The fastest this has been done is over 2 years and 3 months. My driver had earlier hired the TR1 and TR2 type taxis but was so impressed with latest TR4(diesel) that that he bought it. Whether one has a diesel or electric taxi, the maximum service allowed for a vehicle is 15 years. You might be wondering about the cost of my journey. Our book for April is "The Story Collector" by Evie Woods, a tale with a dual timeline and some Irish folklore—sounds intriguing! It had two aims: to revitalise rural communities and encourage women to become more involved in producing food during the First World War. Hence why we are associated with 'Jam' & 'Jerusalem.' ALKHAM HEROES 1939-1945 - On the 5th of May it will be the 80th anniversary of the end of the Second World War. At some moment during our village green party our thoughts will be for the seven lads who lost their lives during that conflict. Below is a short reminder of those heroes. For their full story have a look at Brian's Alkham website (alkham.org) which was researched and documented by Mark Robson and also includes the two village tours he organised to the graves and memorials of our Alkham Heroes. **Den Barnard**



Ernest (Dudley) Richards was an Ordinary Seaman on HMS Gloucester. Ernie was the son of Fred and Elizabeth Gertrude Richards (nee Toulson) and they lived in one of the cottages that now makes up Upton Cottage. Ernie was 'lost with his ship' on Thursday 22nd May 1941, aged 18, and is commemorated on the Chatham Naval Memorial.



Henry Keeler was the son of Charles Keeler and was a Farm Labourer and the family lived at Pimlico. Henry died on Saturday 24th of October 1942 (the start of the Second Battle of El Alamein) aged 22 years and is commemorated on the Alamein Memorial, Egypt.



Louis David Fagg. On the 22nd of October the Royal East Kent Regiment (The Buffs) embarked on the Destroyers HMS Eclipse and HMS Petard. Just after midnight on 23rd/24th of October HMS Eclipse struck a mine and sank in 3 minutes along with Louis and 134 other Buffs. Louis' death is recorded as being on Saturday 23rd of October 1943. As well as the memorial at Alkham, Louis is remembered on the Buffs Roll of Honour and the Athens Memorial.

William Henry Hinds was in the 5th Battalion The Buffs (Royal East Kent Regiment) and was 'killed in action', aged 22, on Wednesday 17th of November 1943. William is buried at Sangro River War Cemetery, Italy. The site of this cemetery was selected by the 5th Corps and into it were brought the graves of men who had died in the fierce fighting on the Adriatic sector of the front in November-December 1943. Presumably this is when William was killed.

Ronald Couchman was in the 5th Battalion Grenadier Guards and was 'killed in action' in Italy on Tuesday, 25th July 1944. The Grenadiers' website reveals that the 5th Battalion was involved in the invasion of North Africa and then Italy at Anzio before fighting their way to Florence. Presumably it was in the heavy fighting around Florence that Ronald was killed. Ronald was 27 years old when he died and is buried in the Florence War Cemetery, he is also remembered on his parents' gravestone in St Anthony's churchyard.



Alan Gavin was a Rifleman in the 2nd Battalion, King's Royal Rifle Corps. He died on Thursday 19th of October 1944 aged 23 years and had lived in Megget Lane. The 2nd Battalion took part in the Normandy landings and then fought through France, Belgium and Holland into Germany. Presumably Alan was killed as part

of this movement. Alan is buried in the Leopoldsburg War Cemetery, Limburg, Belgium and was the last of the Alkham Heroes to be killed in war. **Leonard Saunders** was the son of John and Charlotte Saunders who lived at Drellingore on the Alkham Valley Road. He was in the 17 Field Regiment of the Royal Artillery and he died on the 19th of January 1943 at the age of 35. He is remembered with honour at Medjez-El-Bab War Cemetery in Tunisia. His name is not on the St Anthonys churchyard memorial.

FROM THE VICARAGE - With 8 May 2025 marking the 80th anniversary of VE Day, and events and activities planned up and down the country to commemorate the end of World War II in Europe, I've been reminded of a story that I heard during my student days. Our tutor told us of how at his church one Remembrance Sunday, a young curate had stood up to preach. Beginning his sermon by inviting the congregation to picture a scene from the Battle of the Somme, he was soon interrupted as an elderly man leapt to his feet. "Young puppy!" he snarled as he stormed out. "I was there!" A cautionary tale that I've always remembered when writing my own Remembrance Sunday sermons – for preachers, anything that involves relating what others might remember has to be done with special care. I've heard one preacher begin by describing how, during the war, he had been shot at by a German aircraft – he had been in his pram at the time. But the most memorable was from an old priest who had studied in Germany before the war. He began by quoting from the Old Testament: "Do not forget the LORD, and his righteousness." Describing his own memories of life in 1930s Germany, he spoke of how some friends had invited him to go to a meeting one evening – one at which Hitler himself would speak. From the pulpit, he described what he remembered of what he had heard. His conclusion: the world had gone on to pay a terrible price for forgetting the LORD and his righteousness. Perhaps understandably, the main theme of the 80th anniversary of VE Day events will be one of celebration. But let's also remember those who work for peace and reconciliation in today's world. FROM THE VICARAGE - As we marked the 80th anniversary of VE Day recently, we celebrated a generation who are passing into history. Not only did they go through the War; they learned Bible stories at Grandmother's knee and went to Sunday School. In the Forces they attended Church Parade. When the war ended, some trained as clergy; one, Robert Runcie, having served as a tank commander in Normandy and been decorated for bravery, went on to be Archbishop of Canterbury. In the 1950s, they flocked to Wembley to hear the evangelist Billy Graham preach. But then came the 1960's, and massive social changes. Following generations didn't catch the same churchgoing habit, and now, as a generation passes on and pews empty, some wonder how much longer the dear old C of E will last. And yet... I'm reading Lamorna Ash's book Don't Forget We're Here Forever. The shocking news that a comedy double-act from her university days had not just found faith but planned to be ordained as Anglican priests led her not only to interview them in preparation for her book, but to set out on a journey that took in Christian retreats and church visits across the country. On the way she encountered a range of Christian traditions and met others of her own generation who had also found faith. As she explored what it was that had stirred within them, she found something stirring within herself. Recently, I heard of a local church that I'm told is lively, exciting and full of young people. A recent report by The Bible Society suggests that churchgoing may actually be increasing among the 18-34 age group. This Revival hasn't quite reached us yet - we're having to trim some of our services from this month - but there's hope, nevertheless... Brian Williams

BEE SWARMING Season and Asian Hornet Threat - Bee hives are in full swing now and as the population of a colony increases it becomes necessary to move out. The queen bee will take off with many of the bees to look for a new home leaving a proportion of the colony to 'make' a new queen to revive that hive. In the middle of July last year a swarm descended on our house and made a sterling effort to get into our roof. We fought them off but gave in and with the help of local beekeepers

made a home for them out of part of a beehive, a wheelbarrow and a few plywood offcuts. We then spent several hundred pounds on a hive and apparel and became beekeepers. Unfortunately, as can happen in 1 in 4 cases, the colony did not survive the winter but they did leave a hive full of honey. In our case it was not the Asian Hornet who decimated our bees, there are plenty



of other threats such as varroa mite, cold, mice or death of the queen to list a few. Alkham featured on a recent channel 5 TV programme, "The Secret Lives of Bees" when they explained the problem of the Asian Hornet. The programme presenter walks up Slip Lane and into the garden of a local beekeeper before showing the Hornet's nest high in a tree. The Hornets are exterminated in the nest and the nest retrieved for analysis. The battle continues this year and Hornet traps have been placed and are being monitored. Keep your eyes open for these large wasp-like creatures and report any sitings to alertnonnative@ceh.ac.uk. We were waiting for another swarm to drop in and supply us with more honey but have now placed an order for a new colony of bees with the local bee keeping association. That new home needs a new family. Alan Latham

Set in a peaceful Irish idyll, the peace of the community is shaken up by two unlikely American visitors. The tale built up to moments of tension and mystery and was generally regarded as a pleasurable and relaxed read. In May we turned from frivolous more to a more serious topic of post-war trauma. The book we read, J.L.Carr's "A Month in the Country", was a gentle and sensitive glance into a short period of time experienced by a nerveshattered man, as he found peace. THE NATIONAL TRUST are not showing themselves in a good light in regard to Studley Royal Water Garden, Yorkshire, re pheasant shooting. The land is in private ownership and shooting is legal but NT are responsible for the gardens and opening the grounds to the public. During shooting season, the grounds are closed Friday, for shooting pheasants, which commands a high price to shoot there. The shoot at Studley takes place near water. Thus, many birds are not killed outright but wounded and full of lead shot. They then fall into the water. These wounded birds struggle to survive in the water, without being humanely killed or having any remorse shown to them by the shooters. No doubt shooting scenarios are played out in numerous, privately owned, estates yet administered by the National Trust and open to the public. It does call into question the value of NT Membership if you find this kind of cruelty abhorrent. A parishioner

FROM THE VICARAGE - Our son, who works as a school science technician, arrived home with a flowerpot containing a lemon tree grown from a pip. Having started life in a corner of one of the science labs it now needed a "forever home." We found it a spot on the kitchen windowsill, and it has been there ever since. It was just a couple of inches high with a few glossy green leaves when it arrived. But despite our best efforts, it didn't grow. The leaves lost their shine and shrivelled away. Just a stalk remained – and so it has been ever since. It looks dead, but the stalk remains green. It isn't growing, but it refuses to die. Believe it or not, there are gardening tips in the Bible! For example, Jesus once told a story about a landowner who, having planted a fig tree and not had any fruit from it for three years, told his gardener to cut it down. But the gardener persuaded his boss to wait – he would dig around the tree and put manure on it. If it still didn't bear fruit, then it could be cut down. Jesus' stories always have a double meaning. Jesus knew about plants – and people. His point was that we can all be like fruitless trees - going through life being foolish and selfish, and messing things up. But at the same time we can always make new beginnings and turn our lives around so that we "bear fruit", as Jesus would put it. Most people would have thrown that lemon tree out by now. But whenever I look at it, I think of Jesus' story about the fig tree, and about second chances. So I'll dig around that little tree, feed it, and see what happens... Brian Williams

I WAS REMINDED by Brian's comments about the changing fortunes of the WI and St Anthony's in last month's Newsletter of a conversation I once had with someone whose local village church had recently closed. The strongest objections to its closure, he said, had come from people who hardly ever went to church! When I retire, responsibility for the Parish will pass to the Area Dean and the churchwardens to begin with - what will happen in the longer term remains to be seen. When I arrived the average weekly attendance at St Anthony's was 16. People prayed and cared for not just each other, but for the whole village. But that changed with Covid - like many churches, St Anthony's struggled to recover after the pandemic. St Anthony's remains popular for christenings, weddings and funerals. Easter Day and Remembrance Sunday were well supported last year, as were our Christmas services - but regular Sunday services are a different matter. We have bellringers, and a willing team who decorate the church for Christmas and Harvest. But to stay alive, a church needs a congregation. To remain sustainable, we have had to reduce our Sunday services to just one a month—on the 2nd Sunday at 9.30. So, please could you give just one hour a month to keep St Anthony's going? Do you like singing? Come and sing the hymns – you could try singing the harmonies; Come and pray for yourself, for others and whatever is on your mind. If words won't come, light a candle; Think about what you hear. You don't have to agree with all of it. Parish churches aren't funded by the taxpayer. Please could you consider joining the Parish Giving Scheme and giving a little towards St Anthony's running costs? Please support St Anthony's - don't lose it. Brian Williams

ST. ANTHONY'S - As a previous Alkham resident and churchwarden, St Anthony's holds a special place in my heart. I was saddened to see from Revd. Brian's report that the church is going to be on what I interpret as "life support" after his retirement next month. Founded by the monks at St Radigunds Abbey, has it come, that after 800 years of continuous use, and with a higher, and more prosperous village population than ever, this beautiful Grade 1 listed building is potentially to become, like at Swingfield, a heritage curiosity open once a year? Has individual wealth come at the cost of collective poverty? I don't have the answers, but I do have some observations. As the worshipping congregation reduces and ages, the administrative and financial burden on those remaining becomes, at a point, unsustainable. Community will and action, aided by the Friends of St Anthony's working with the church family, is the only way to ensure its future viability. At least have a public debate about what you want for the future of the building. Reimagining the use beyond Sunday worship is needed. That's why we put the kitchenette and toilet in some years ago. As a demonstration of support, could the Parish Council meeting be held in the church from time to time? Basically, it's about breathing new life into St Anthony's and bringing her out of intensive care. After all, Alkham Fete was rumoured to be dead some years ago, but had a resurrection thanks to Community willpower and a lot of hard work. With God's help, miracles can and do happen. FOX HUNTING - In last month's newsletter there was an article based on an email received from a parishioner that said that trail hunting was a smoke screen and that fox hunting was continuing. Following that an email has been received from a parishioner who firmly disagreed with this and said: There is only one hunt left in Kent and that huntsman provides an excellent service driving miles around the whole of Kent for horse owners and livestock farmers, collecting and even shooting animals that have to be disposed of. A tradition that has gone on before the word 'recycle' was invented- as it goes to feed the hounds. The hunt genuinely lays trails and are constantly watched and filmed by protesters, who are trespassing on land and ruining the trails. The hunt would be crazy if they suddenly went after real foxes. However sometimes the foxhounds cross the scent of a real fox and it is hard to call them off this scent as they have been bred to be the best at scenting foxes over hundreds of years but the huntsman always tries to correct this. I think if you add an article asking if people would like to sign a petition to ban trail hunting, you need to balance it with an option to try and save foxhounds being able to work and the huntsman providing a genuinely excellent service collecting deadstock.




PETANQUE at the Village Hall

TIGER MOTHS – In the Second World War there were a number of emergency landing strips where badly damaged aircraft could land as a safe haven and not block the runway on the major airfields. There were two near Alkham one of which was at Chalksole and the other and more important one was at Swingfield which is about two miles from Alkham towards the A260. John Huggins sent a picture of three Tiger Moths which made an emergency landing on his airfield at Chalksole recently because of poor visibility over the coast on their way back from Switzerland. The Tiger Moth was used in WW2 mainly for training and maritime surveillance but also did light bombing missions so perhaps some landed near Alkham over 80 years ago.

TRAFFIC – The person who sent the email about traffic problems that featured on the front page of the November newsletter has said there has been no reply from KCC. He says what KCC do not seem to understand is that explanations of the reason for their breach of responsibilities does not justify their inactivity or absolve them from their duty of care to the public from known safety risks.

ATTENTION ALL DOG OWNERS - It is an offence under the Clean Neighbourhood and Environmental Act 2005 to allow your dog to foul in public areas this includes pavements, footpaths, verges, play areas, roads, playing fields and green spaces. This act requires all dog owners and walkers, including children to clear up after their



dog and place the bag in a bin. It is also an offence to leave the full bag hanging on trees or gates. This is a particular problem in Short Lane and is getting worse. It is very unpleasant for people with pushchairs, young children, gardeners and road users. One resident recently had their hedges cut on and the poor hedge man had to deal with a lot of dog mess which is pretty nasty for him and for us as we try to improve the hedges. Offenders can be fined up to £1000 by the local authority. Please pick up after

MALMAINS MANOR is one of the historic houses in Alkham and is situated near the centre of the village on Slip Lane. It has recently had a lot of work carried out on it which includes the house itself and the flint wall around it to which a pair of magnificent gates and brick faced uprights have been added which shows off the beauty of the house. In the 18th century it was a simple timber framed house called Coombe Hole but was gradually enlarged and given the regency look in the 19th century. In 1900 the famous music hall Lupino family lived there with two sisters living in the adjacent Rose Cottage and the Lupino daughters and family often gave performances in the village. Alkham Villa as it was called at that time had a generator installed and in 1911 displayed electric illuminations across the gateway to celebrate the coronation of George V much to the delight of the local children. In 1955 it was owned by the socialite Princess of Sayn-Wittgenstein-Sayn of German and Austrian nobility who entertained famous guests in Germany until 2010 and died in May this year aged 105 and perhaps she entertained guests in Alkham.
